The Brazilian Curriculum

The BNCC

The BNCC is Brazil's National Common Curricular Base standardises education across the country and requires pupils to complete all four knowledge areas. Portuguese, English, and Maths are compulsory in all academic years.

Languages (Portuguese, English, The Arts, Physical Education)

Science (Chemistry, Biology, Physics)

Mathematics (Maths and Computing)

Humanities (History and Geography)

* Computing: it was included as a knowledge area in 2022. Schools have one year to adapt.

The school covers all areas through the Key Stage 3, 4, and 5 curriculum models.

Ensino Fundamental – Begins in Junior School (Prep) and is completed at the end of Form 4.

Ensino Medio – Form 5, Lower 6, and Upper 6.

Regimento Escolar

Brazilian by-laws, a legal and binding document that must be updated annually and submitted to the local education authority. This document presents the school's rules and structure, and defines and regulates the teaching institution.

Projeto Político-Pedagógico (PPP) / Projeto Pedagógico

This document is mandatory. It should contain a variety of information, including Mission, Clientele, Learning data, Relationship with families, Resources, Pedagogical guidelines, and Action plans.
